

Neighbors App by Ring + Local Law Enforcement



Key Talking Points

- The Marseilles Police Department is excited to join the Neighbors app by Ring as a new way to provide real-time crime and safety information to our community.
- Ring launched the Neighbors app in May of 2018 as a free way for community members and local law enforcement to share real-time local crime and safety information whether or not they own a Ring device.
- The Neighbors app network has millions of users across the nation and has already been instrumental in catching package thieves, stopping burglaries, and keeping neighborhoods safe.
- Marseilles residents can text marseillespo to 555888 from their smartphone and instantly the Neighbors app for free on iOS and Android.
- Once downloaded, residents can join their digital neighborhood and use the app to: monitor neighborhood activity; share crime and safety-related videos, photos and text-based posts; and receive regional safety alerts from their neighbors, local law enforcement and the Ring team all in real time.
- Through partnering with Neighbors by Ring, Marseilles Police Department will be able to:
 - Send alerts to Neighbors about local crime and safety incidents in the area in real-time.
 - Request information about local crime and safety situations from Neighbors who opt-in to sharing for a particular request.
 - Work together with the local community to build trust and make neighborhoods safer.
- Like other social media sharing platforms, our participation on the Neighbors app is not meant to replace 911. If residents see a crime occur they are encouraged to immediately report the incident through official department channels.
- All tips shared via Neighbors are anonymous unless residents choose to identify themselves, as anonymous tips are an important tactic already used to solve crimes.
- This does not grant law enforcement access to cameras or user data. Law enforcement can only view content posted by users to the Neighbors app or that they have decided to share with us directly in response to a specific request.
- You do not need to own a Ring device or any other home security system in order to
 download and use the Neighbors app. Local residents are encouraged to download the free
 Neighbors app in order to keep up with real-time crime and safety updates and participate in the
 digital neighborhood watch straight from their smartphones.

Neighbors & Law Enforcement Partnerships



What is the partnership benefit?

 The Neighbors app lets you easily share and communicate with your neighbors about crime and safety so you have real-time, local crime data at your fingertips. The Neighbors app facilitates communication between neighbors, which is a crucial element of crime prevention.

How is Neighbors different from other platforms / Apps?

- Neighbors is about crime and safety only.
- o Residents must verify location in order to post / comment.
- All users post anonymously (like a tip line)
- Law Enforcement can view what residents are sharing, engage the public in their investigations and provide residents with hyper-local crime and safety information.
- Neighbors features allows it to function as a true digital neighborhood watch.

Is law enforcement able to access user data or cameras through Neighbors?

 No user data, or even the existence of a camera at a specific location, is shared without prior consent of the device owner. Law enforcement can only see posts that users share publicly; they do not have access to users' devices, video or data.

Why is law enforcements participation on the app useful?

- Neighbors enables the Marseilles Police Department to:
 - Share important crime and safety updates with local communities in real-time.
 - Request information about local crime and safety situations from Neighbors who opt-in to sharing for a particular request.
 - Work together with the local community to build trust and make neighborhoods safer.

Does the Neighbors app collaborate with other apps like Facebook and NextDoor that get used by neighborhoods?

 Yes, Neighbors posts are shareable with other major social platforms. We encourage users to share crime posts to build awareness of local incidents and help identify criminals acting in the area.

Can only Ring videos be shared on Neighbors?

 No. All videos, images, and text can be uploaded and posted to Neighbors. Videos from all cameras can be uploaded.

How does Ring Neighbors work with law enforcement? How much access does law enforcement have to my Ring device? If any?

- Neighbors users can choose whether to share their Ring videos with law enforcement in the app.
- Law enforcement can view the publicly available content in the Neighbors app and request content from Neighbors in a certain area and time range where an incident may have occurred. If law enforcement is interested in seeing a certain video, Ring will ask the user if he/she is willing to share footage with law enforcement. The police do not have a way to contact users outside of the app, which keeps identities hidden.

How many agencies have partnered with the Neighbors App?

 Dozens of agencies nationwide have joined the Neighbors App and are currently using it to engage with their communities.
